AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN ACT 2021

To combat the economic impact of the COVID-19 pandemic, the federal government established a \$1.9 trillion-dollar stimulus package called the American Rescue Plan (ARP). The good news is that a portion of these funds is dedicated specifically to state and local governments to help address lost revenue and other negative impacts the pandemic has had on jurisdictions around the country.

Funds allocated specifically to state and local government through the Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Fund (CFRF)

### SAM Registration

Register or renew registration with official government-wide database (>50k population)

### Eligible entities (>50k population)

Can receive funding directly from the Treasury through a submission portal <https://api.id.me/en/session/new>

### Non-Entitlement Government Units (<50k population)

Must obtain funds from their applicable state government

### DUNS Number

Obtain this unique 9-digit number so the federal government can track money allocated (all government entities)

**December 31st, 2024** Deadline for committed spend of funds
